# What are you looking at?



I smile wryly at this; at the realisation of the intrinsic rhythm of nature in all its shapes and forms and the effects of one small change to the seamless running of things. Perhaps it's the same for ourselves in this current situation. No doubt we have adjusted to staying close to home and 'bunkering down' over our own brood. Perhaps, in some cases, relationships have been challenged and re-formed as a result. Perhaps there is nothing to be done but follow the flow of instinct with a large degree of trust and hope that things will come right again.



I hope you and your parish are doing well during these unusual times. My name is Rachael Kinkead, and I am based in the parish of Wicklow and Killiskey (my husband Jack is the rector here). I am a primary school teacher and a part-time Master's student at U.C.D., where I am undertaking the course MA: Scríobh agus Cumarsáid na Gaeilge. For the purpose of my thesis I would like to invite a small number of young adults (aged 18-30) from the Church of Ireland tradition to articulate their perspectives on Irish language and Irish identity in the context of their minority faith community. Thus, I am contacting you to ask if you might facilitate me in this endeavour.

# **WHAT**

Thesis title: 'As Irish as the Irish Language? Perspectives on the interplay between Irish language and Irish identity within the Church of Ireland community'.

## **WHO**

Participants are eligible if they:

- are Irish citizens
- are practising members of the Church of Ireland
- are aged 18-30
- are currently residing in the counties of Dublin, Wicklow, Kildare, Carlow, Laois, Kilkenny or Wexford
- have resided in the counties of Dublin, Wicklow, Kildare, Carlow, Laois, Kilkenny or Wexford during their primary and secondary school years
- studied Irish to Leaving Cert level, i.e. they were not exempt from the subject

### WHERE

Interviews will take place through a video-conferencing platform.

## **WHEN**

Interviews will be organised at a time that suits the participant and will take no longer than 60 minutes.


We all want to do our bit to keep our community safe and are willing to:
