Just yesterday morning, I welcomed Colm Ryan and his team of professional gardeners into Powerscourt Graveyard.

The Vestry decision to hire Colm as fulltime gardener with responsibility for our

Graveyard is a new and exciting step forward for our Parish, particularly at difficult times such as these. Colm (second from the left in the picture) comes highly recommended and plans are afoot to restore the parts of our Graveyard which have fallen into disrepair during the Pandemic and for its continued maintenance throughout

the next 12 months and on. A Graveyard maintenance plan (put together by professional gardeners Tim Weldon and David Koning) held at its heart one crucial element; the graveyard should be cared for by someone

who called it their own and truly invested in it. There is great pride associated with this and the results will speak for themselves. Alongside the almost immediate benefits this care will show within its walls, there is the added advantage of a regular presence within the graveyard itself, making it a safer environment for people passing through.

This is the beginning of a more holistic plan for this jewel in the crown of Powerscourt Parish and one of the finest graveyards in the South of the Country. From the vantage point of the upper story windows of the Rectory, I witnessed the regular passage of people through this Holy Space throughout the restrictions of lockdown earlier in the year; some staying for a while on the benches beneath the trees.

Our immense gratitude to Tim Weldon and David Koning for embracing this idea and sourcing Colm and his team to step in and restore and to the Select Vestry of Powerscourt Parish for adopting this proposal.

Do say hello if you're passing. These are faces we hope you will come to recognise as a caring presence within the graveyard walls!

Gravestone of the Week



Norman and Eileen Galbraith were the son and daughter of the Venerable Archdeacon Henry Galbraith, Rector of this parish for 30 years, who died in 1905. Norman was born in the "new" Rectory on the Cookstown road, which had been built in 1874 for the Rev Henry, when he arrived to take up his post in Enniskerry.

Norman, born in 1878, worked in the Colonial Office in Ceylon, from 1902. He died in 1915 on active service in WW 1, in Cairo, and his name is on the

War Memorial in the church. It was unusual for the remains of deceased soldiers to be repatriated in War time, but here he rests in home ground.

The headstone also tells the story of his sisters, Alice and Eileen, who, when their father died, went out to the Sudan as Missionaries. Alice died in Sudan in 1920. She was much older than her step-sister and brother, and had helped to bring them up in the Enniskerry Rectory. Eileen married a Scottish doctor, whom she met during the war, Dr Kenneth Fraser, and together they founded and for years developed a very successful ministry in Lui, Sudan. They built a hospital in memory of Norman Galbraith. Eileen died in Nairobi in 1946.

In recent times, their story had been forgotten, until a theological student from Sudan visited the church and asked where Eileen Fraser was buried. He was shocked to find that we knew nothing about her. He was making a special visit sixty years after her death to stand at her graveside. He was much too young ever to have met her, but he told us she was revered in his homeland, he said, "She was our mother".

The headstone was cleaned by representatives of the War Graves Commission in 2014 to commemorate the centenary of the Great War.
