Our churches remain open alongside the weekly online Sunday worship, and we are delighted to announce the launch of a Contemporary Service on 19th September next. This service combines the structure of a Sunday service with a more modern style incorporating recorded music and it is our hope to establish a regular worship band to play at these services which will take place on the third Sunday of every month in St. Patrick's Powerscourt. This Service is introduced to 'grow' the parish by encouraging younger families to worship as well as our primary and secondary school children and is contrasted by the more traditional worship style to be found in St. Brigid's Kilbride. Working together, both churches offer a wider range of worship for a wide age-group every Sunday morning.

For many people the world over, the past 18 months have been a time of great loss and suffering. Emerging from restrictions, we hope to pay tribute to the lives lost during Covid 19 in a '*Remembering Service*' held on 31st October next, marking All Soul's Day. Our traditional Remembrance Service will also take place on Sunday 14th November.

As a means of Community outreach we open the doors of St. Patrick's Church to the Shaking Bog Festival this year by facilitating a conversation between the artist Joe Hogan (weaver) and Maureen Kennelly (Director of The Arts Council) on the Friday evening (10th September), at 6.30 pm and small and intimate presentation from the poet Liz Berry and the musician/fiddler Paddy Glackin on Saturday (11th September) at 3pm.



Please note as some restrictions remain in place, these gatherings are very small and are keenly monitored by the festival with regard to pre-booking, social distancing and safety measures. We hope that this small beginning will yield greater results for outreach in our community and within the beautiful settings of both our churches in years to come when the doors can be open to the public for such events.

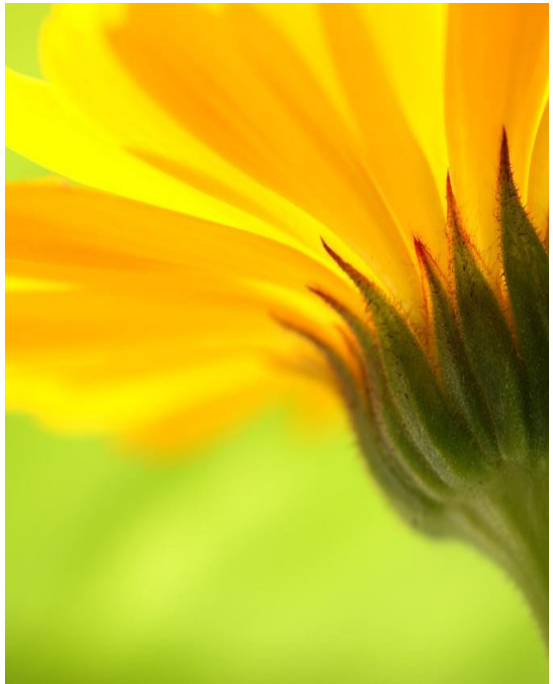

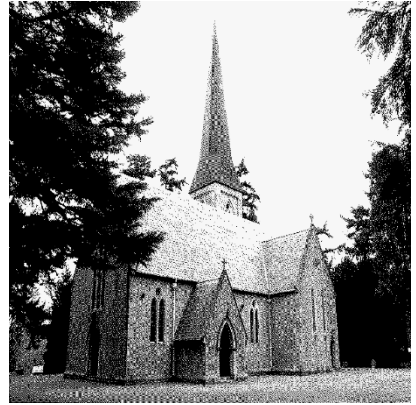

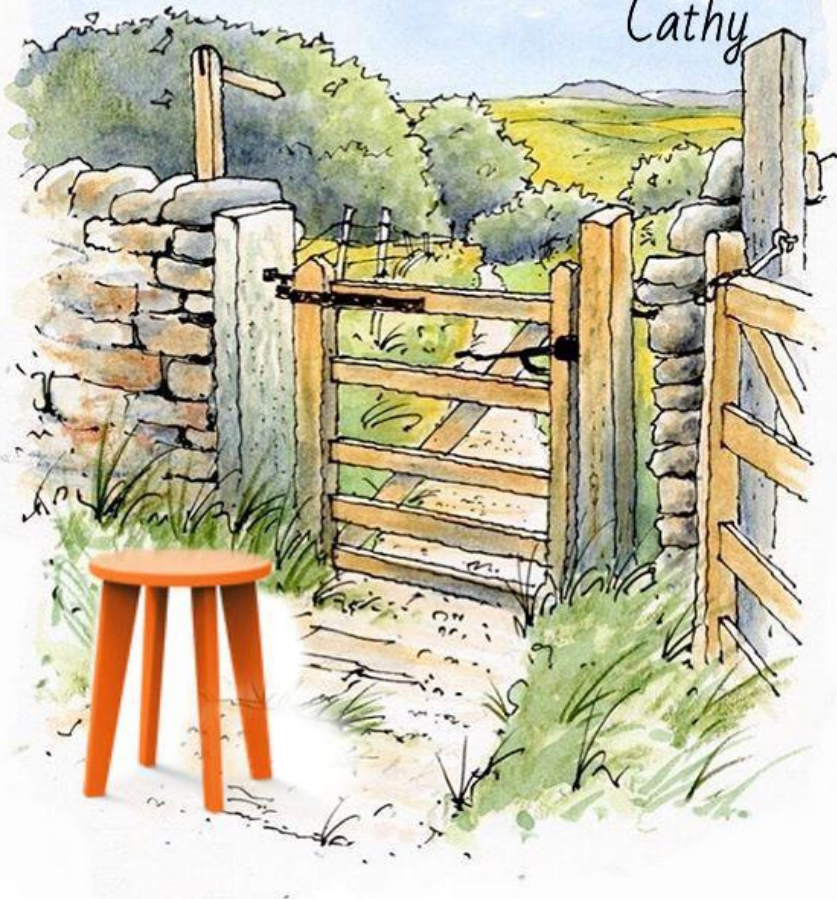
